I was informed by my IRS appointed lawyer, Michael Ellis, on September 21 2009, I would need to make a \$25,000 “cash payment” to Revenue Officer Susan Meador to resolve a “*penalties and interest dispute*” that the US and the IRS created when they stop paying us for CMS Ambulance Service claims in May 2008.

Ellis informed us in early June of 2009 when he reached out to us that “*Congress was aware of the situation*” and the IRS was supposed to “*correct an evil and make us whole*” and write of any penalties and interest and match. Officer Meador apparently was not willing to make adjustments for us, “*as she did for his other clients in the area with the same situation*”. After exploring the reasons why, she was “*hard on me*”, we came to politics, to which I admitted I was involved in Conservative Politics. I told him I was not interested in the “*cash payment*” and that was the last conversation we had. His assistance was preparing a Tax Advocate Assistant request at the time also. This came across as a bribe to me. When the Tax Advocates office contacted me the only question they had was, “*Are you a Medicare provider?*” They also said, “*we will take care of it.*” My Department of Justice Contract contact had earlier warned me of unethical Revenue Officers. I was unaware that she filed a Notice of Federal Tax lien and put us out of business in 2008.

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
